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INTRODUCTION

Introduction

This Internationalization Plan aims to promote UEMA's (State University of Maranhão) internationalization employing institutional policies and actions aimed at undergraduate and graduate courses. The aim is to improve the quality of teaching, research, and extension, sharing knowledge and collaborating with the enabling of trained and prepared human resources to work at the national and international level.

In this context, for the implementation of the Internationalization Plan, strategic axes were prioritized, aiming at the insertion of UEMA in the international context, having as a starting point the consonance with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) adopted by the United Nations (2015). Thus, the aim is to make UEMA a receptive environment for researchers, teachers, students, and technicians from foreign institutions, aiming to interact and share knowledge while carrying out joint activities.

Our main idea is to understand the academic context involving teaching, research, and extension, in addition to language training and performance of the administrative sectors (the Superintendency of International Relations). We seek to promote better opportunities, enhance international cooperation already established and find new partnerships to consolidate the internationalization process.

The 17 Sustainable Development Goals developed by the UN aim to give global sustainability, focusing on peace and prosperity, as well as on people and the planet. The UN global partnership recognizes that actions are needed for "a global course of action to end poverty, promote prosperity and well-being for all, protect the environment and tackle climate change".

UEMA, therefore, is entering a new phase of internationalization and maturity, which reflects new objectives and goals. In this new phase, we highlight the commitment to reinforce an international profile and a vision to become a university of excellence with the contribution of all the peoples of the world, aiming to learn, think and work together.

It is part of our responsibility, as educators, to prepare students and researchers to participate in the multicultural society and help them become global citizens in the future because this whole group of thinkers will be part of an open, borderless world. Their ability to understand and interact in this world - with an open mind - is being built now, at the University.





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UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE TEACHING

1. Undergraduate and graduate teaching

With the previous objectives in mind, we have the goals of the following segments of the university below: teaching, research, extension, and administrative sectors.

In terms of teaching, UEMA understands the fundamental importance of enabling the presence of foreign students and teachers within the classroom. Foreign language teaching as a second language is also a key point for university graduates to be able to work professionally in multicultural environments.

For that, the strategies to be adopted and the objectives, actions, and deadlines detailed in Tables 2 and 3 are listed below:

- Enable teacher and student mobility for international partner institutions, to increase the flow in the scope of undergraduate and graduate courses;
- Stimulate the participation of undergraduate and graduate students in public notices from development agencies and transnational companies aiming at international internships or short courses;
- Make adjustments to the curricular components of undergraduate and graduate courses, aiming to take advantage of credits from subjects taken abroad;
- Encourage the participation of UEMA's undergraduate and graduate students in foreign events;
- Create policies and actions to attract foreign students to postgraduate courses;
- Encourage the participation of visiting professors from foreign institutions in undergraduate and graduate courses, through specific policies and actions to attract external teachers:
- Create resolutions aiming at the implementation of international academic agreements to encourage co-teaching and double degree, concretizing the cooperation between partner institutions;
- Support and implement actions that enable the elevation of the concepts of the graduate courses to 5 and 6, by the evaluation of CAPES;
- Use educational tools (e-learning) as a way of facilitating virtual mobility and promoting the internationalization of courses;
- Create and consolidate International Academic Exchange programs in undergraduate and graduate courses, such as sandwich scholarships, short courses, technical visits, and internships in different areas of knowledge.

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RESEARCH GUIDELINES

2. Research guidelines

In terms of teaching, UEMA understands the fundamental importance of enabling the presence of foreign students and teachers within the classroom. The teaching of languages as a second language is also a key point for university graduates to be able to work professionally in multicultural environments.

For the internationalization of research, UEMA presents the guidelines below, and the objectives, actions, and deadlines are detailed in Chart 4:

- Stimulate and facilitate the participation of teaching researchers in public notices that promote internationalization, made available by FAPEMA, CAPES, CNPq, among other national and international development agencies;
- Support and facilitate the increase in the number of scientific articles published in international journals with a high impact factor and/or *qualis* recognized by CAPES, with the participation of foreign researchers in authorship and coauthorship;
- Enable the increase in the number of scientific articles co-authored with foreign researchers;
- Increase the number of professors and students involved in international academic mobility, aiming at exchanging and obtaining new research methodologies;
- Stimulate the participation of the teaching staff in public notices to promote research by foreign agencies or in partnership with national agencies;
- Stimulate the partnership of foreign researchers in the development of joint projects with local researchers;
- Enable the launch of institutional notices, related to attracting researchers, in Portuguese and English, to facilitate the participation of foreign researchers;
- Create internationalization strategies at home, with specific actions, such as hiring
 a visiting professor to assist in offering courses taught in English, offering
 scientific writing courses in English, preparing and displaying banners in the
 English language, among others;

- Create a discussion forum on the diffusion of science and technology, emerging global problems, aimed at the ideal of social transformation, involving students and teachers in the process of international mobilization;
- Promote and enable the participation of foreign students and researchers to carry out Extension activities with LABEX, undergraduate, and graduate courses at UEMA.

4. Guidelines for UEMA's linguistic policy

- Adopt a second language to facilitate the visibility of Uema in the international context; platform and budget already authorized by the rector;
- Stimulate the use of foreign languages in the classroom and in other academic spaces;
- Translate UEMA's web page and undergraduate and graduate courses in the webpage into English, to attract foreign professors and students;
- Enable the hiring of specialized companies to support the translation of scientific articles;
- Stimulate the introduction of syllabus contents of foreign language subjects in Postgraduate courses;
- Stimulate the presentation of works in national and international events in a foreign language;
- Consolidate the offer of Portuguese courses for foreigners;
- Invest and improve the conditions of teacher and student preparation for the internationalization of UEMA;
- Intermediate, with the Language Center / NUCLIN, the provision of language courses for students, teachers and administrative technicians;
- Invest in the implementation of proficiency exam offers in English and Spanish for students, teachers, administrative technicians and residents of the state of Maranhão.
- To avoid duplication of information, we emphasize that the strategic objectives, actions and deadlines of the Language Policy (# PL #) are inserted in the strategic objectives for teaching in undergraduate, graduate and research.

5. Guidelines for Administrative Management and the Superintendence for International Relations

For the internationalization of administration, UEMA presents the guidelines below, and the objectives, actions, and deadlines are detailed in Chart 6:

- Stimulate the partnership for the development of extension actions with international institutions;
- Intensify contacts with internationalization agents Capes, CNPq, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Embassies and Consulates, aiming at the identification of priority areas for internationalization;
- Promote UEMA's visibility abroad, including the preparation and updating of bilingual material;
- Represent UEMA in participation in internationalization events;
- Make agreements and partnerships with international institutions providing the involvement of the largest possible number of researchers;
- Promote international missions:
- Disseminate the experiences of teachers and students involved in the international mobility process;
- Simplifying and making institutional procedures more flexible for the development of scientific and technological projects in partnership with foreign institutions;
- Intermediate the allocation of institutional budgetary resources to support internationalization programs, supplementing those obtained from development agencies;
- Make local students aware of the importance of taking the exam in a foreign language;
- Expand the offer and make it possible to carry out proficiency exams in a foreign language.
